Town of New Holstein Annual Town Meeting

Town Hall April 16th 2019 7:30

The annual meeting for the Town of New Holstein was called to order at 7:30 pm by Chairman, Gary Winkler. Fifteen residents and two nonresidents were present. The pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Chairman Winkler extended a thank you to all in attendance.

Minutes from the 2018 annual meeting were read by Clerk, Cheryl Heller. A motion to accept the minutes as read was made by Jeff Beck, seconded by Josh Mertens and approved without dissent

Heller reported the town will be getting a new voting machine. Heller also reported that, in an effort to keep the lines down we may have split poll books in the fall elections. She thanked her poll workers for their dedication. The treasurers' report was given by Treasurer Mary Jo Muellenbach, A motion to accept the treasurers' report was made by Scott Schmitt seconded by John Poch and carried

unanimously.

Mary Jo Muellenbach reported the information about the recycling grant hasn't been released yet, but explained how the money is distributed. Muellenbach also reported the garbage bin sizes have changed due to different

manufacturers, so they will now just be called small, medium, and large. Muellenbach reported on the East shore tire recycle event, and said to watch the paper for other

recycle events.

Supervisor Dean Konen gave the road report; Konen reported on completed road work in the past year, and reported on the impacts of the August 30 storm, and recent flooding. Konen said in the upcoming year we will be replacing culverts as two failed in the spring floods and many in the town need repair or replacement before they fail. He also stated they will be working on replacing signs with poor reflectivity.

Supervisor Ben Henke reported the gutter installation and resealing of the roof will take place this spring. Discussed the Boom mower issues and reported the town would start looking into the best option in regards to mowing. Henke also reported all truck blades are now carbide, and the wing of truck #2 is carbide.

Scott Tennessen, Assessor, could not attend; Chairman Gary Winkler reported there were 31 building permits for the year, 2 being for new homes. Winkler announced Open Book and Board of Review will take place May 15th and May 29th respectively.

A motion to borrow money in an emergency to purchase equipment was made by Doug Franzen, seconded by Randy Schmitt, motion carried without dissent. A brief discussion followed with semi and manure tanker concerned being discussed, and also our sandbox for residents being misused. The town will try putting up a sign asking for a two, five-gallon pail limit, in hopes it doesn't get abused. Discussions about culverts, ditching and snowplowing took place, during the road report. Mary Franzen made a motion to hold the 2020 annual meeting on the 3rd Tuesday in April, being, Tuesday April 21th 2020, 7:30 pm at the New Holstein Town Hall, It was seconded by Scott Schmitt and carried without dissent. A motion to adjourn was made at 8:52 pm by Jeff Beck seconded by Josh Mertens and carried unanimously Draft minutes subject to approval at the 2020 annual meeting.
